You've done a good job of selecting a significant topic and compiling relevant research on that topic in preparation for this paper. You've also done a good job of creating a distinct introduction, body and conclusion for your essay in this draft. This is a good start!

For your revisions, I suggest focusing on:

1. Purpose: The purpose of this paper is to convince the reader of your way of thinking on a debatable topic. The debatable topic is not made clear in this draft. Remember, it must be assumed that one can take an opposing stance to the one argued in your paper. Consider narrowing your focus on this issue in your next draft to help highlight one of the debatable topics within this issue. For example, you could argue that one only needs motivation in order to succeed.

2. Thesis: Conclude your introductory paragraph with an argumentative thesis statement. A thesis conveys your position on a topic and provides focus for your essay. In other words, it is what you are hoping to accomplish or prove in this paper. In it, you will state a claim about motivation and introduce the topics you will discuss in support of that claim. The statement should be strongly worded. Avoid using hedging words, or speaking in generalities. Here you want to be firm and specific. 3. Paragraph Development: Focus the discussion presented in each paragraph to one supporting topic for your claim. Body paragraphs have 3 basic parts: the topic sentence, the information, and the explanation. The acronym "PIE" can be helpful in remembering these parts. The topic sentence (P) points out the topic of the paragraph and transitions from the topic previously discussed. Once you introduce that topic, you need to provide (I) information. Information will come in the form of your own details and examples. It will also come in the form of direct quotes, paraphrases and summaries from your research. Only include the information that directly relates to your talking point in the paragraph. Finally, and most importantly, (E) explain why that discussion supports the claim about motivation presented in your thesis statement. You will repeat this for each body paragraph until you get to your concluding paragraph.
